As we navigate our way through this unprecedented health and economic crisis, many government leaders are under pressure to rescue economies in free-falling and loosen up stringent restrictions to encourage shuttered businesses to open again. COVID-19 AND THE LABOR LAW UNDERSTANDING THE LEGAL IMPLICATIONS OF "NO WORK NO PAY"

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a devastating impact on workplaces in Thailand, forcing many employers to take drastic measures such as temporarily suspending operations in order to save their businesses. This situation is especially traumatic for affected staff, as, at present, there is no clear indication as to how long this crisis will last and there is uncertainty as to what the employees' legal rights are in the event that their employment is suspended or terminated. This area of the law is not well settled, however, below is a summary of the current status "No Work No Pay" principle and another measure allowing employers to suspend employment of employees in crisis situations under Thai labor law.

1. No Work No Pay

No Work No Pay is not specifically defined by statue, however, it is a recognized legal principle under Thai law, whereby, in certain extreme crisis circumstances employers are legally allowed to temporarily suspend the employment of staff without the legal
